All shows are SVHSA pointed! Sign up with SVHSA for their Year End awards as well!

CRC YEAR END AWARDS-FREE SIGN UP! Members interested in having their points counted and calculated for the Year End Awards must sign up at the secretary's stand prior to having points counted. Points will be counted the day we receive your sign up sheet, through the end of the year. There is no fee, we only ask that we have record to be able to follow those interested in the Awards.

DIVISIONS: **Youth A** = 13 & under as of January 1 of the current year. **Youth B** = 14-18 as of January 1 of the current year. **Non-pro** = 19 and over as of the current year, amateur rider who does not take money for training or showing horses. **Beginner** = riders who are in their first or second year of showing in any division or discipline. **Lead line** = 9 & under who can safety sit on a horse/pony, may not show in any other division. **Open** = Open to all unless otherwise stated, does not include Lead line. **Junior Novice Horse** = Horses ages 5 and under and in their first or second year of showing in any division or discipline. **Senior Novice Horse** = Horses 6 and over in their first or second year of showing in any division or discipline. **Jackpot classes** (30, 31, 50) = \$10.00 pay at gate. Cash or check. 50% paid to appropriate circuit, payback 25%, 15%, 10%.

DIRECTIONS: Grounds located at: 1800 Franklin Street, Columbia, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania 17512. Take route 30 to the Prospect Road exit. Go south on Prospect Road to Rt. 462. Turn right and follow Rt. 462 West for 1.2 miles. The Show Committee makes the final decision on any changes or disputes that occur during the shows.
Liability waivers and membership applications and fees must be paid in advance to receive discount fees at CRC shows.
If a dispute occurs over a class or placing, the protest must be brought to the attention of a member of the show committee, show secretary or show steward.
Under no circumstances is an exhibitor or spectator allowed to approach a judge for any reason without a Show Committee member or show steward present.
The judge and show committee have the right to excuse all horses or riders which present a threat or danger to other horses, riders and spectators from the class or show grounds and all entry fees will be forfeited.
Good sportsmanship is expected.
There shall be no abusive language or actions to any horse or people at any time, inside or outside of the show rings.
Riders must wear proper riding attire. No tank tops, halter tops or swimsuits. Boots or riding shoes with heels are required.
It is highly recommended that all riders wear safety helmets.
It is mandatory that all junior riders wear protective headgear for gaming and jumping.
Wearing helmets will not be penalized in English or Western pleasure and equitation classes.
All Halter Classes may be shown in either English or Western Attire.
All tack changes should be announced to the show committee at least one class prior to the start of the class. Five minutes will be allowed for changes.
All classes have a one-minute gate call. After your number or class has been announced, you have one minute to enter the show ring.
No cantering/loping is allowed along outside rails of show rings. All schooling horses must be done a reasonable distance from the show rings.
Please leave the gate areas clear for exhibitors to enter and exit the show rings.
No lunging in the ring.
All entries are assigned one number to each horse. That number shall be used for the entire year at all CRC series shows.
Youth under the age of 18 as of the current year may not handle/exhibit a stallion.
There is a \$35.00 returned check fee. Anyone previously giving a bad check will be on a cash only policy for the rest of the season.
Anyone paying by check and not paying in full at the time of sign up must leave an open check.
All accounts must be paid in full by the end of each show.
There will be no cash refunds on entries except for cases of illness or injury or upon cancellation of a class.
In case of injury, CRC has the right to call for medical assistance.
All dogs must be on a leash, tied to an object or person with a leash no longer than 6 feet and kept away from show rings. Please leave aggressive dogs at home.
All Children under the age 17 must be accompanied by an adult.
Please keep manure on CRC property.
The Columbia Riding Club, its officers and members will not be responsible for accident, injury or loss of person, livestock or property.
By entering a class, you confirm that you agree/understand these rules.

IN HAND TRAIL RULES:

Exhibitors may show in either English or Western attire and tack.
The horse may be fully tacked, or perform in a halter or bridle only. If showing in a halter, it must fit the animal properly and may or may not include a chain on the lead.
An exhibitor may show any number of animals in the IN-Hand Trail class.
Leading and working obstacles should be performed from the left side of the horse at all times. Backing obstacles may be performed by standing in front of the horse.
The exhibitor may use one hand to cue the horse in a side pass maneuver; otherwise, the lead should remain in the right hand, and the coil/reins in the left hand.
Exhibitor is not allowed to touch the horse, except when side passing.
Exhibitor must perform the pattern with the horse, keeping their feet inside any boxes, jogging over rails, and backing through obstacles.
Exception is the exhibitor does NOT have to walk on the bridge, but horse must, if applicable.
Appearance of exhibitor and horse will be considered, including the following items:
a. Correctness of the horse while being led
b. Drifting side to side, stopping crooked, sluggish behavior
c. Excessive verbal cues and unnatural movement
d. Dragging lead shank or reins, and holding the chain

HORSE SHOW DIVISIONS:

Youth A = 13 & under as of January 1 of the current year. Youth B = 14-18 as of January 1 of the current year
Non-pro = 19 and over as of the current year, amateur rider who does not take money for training or showing horses
Beginner = riders who are in their first or second year of showing in any division or discipline
Lead line = 9 & under who can safely sit on a horse/pony, may not show in any other division
Open = Open to all unless otherwise stated, does not include Lead line
Junior Novice Horse = Horses ages 5 and under and in their first or second year of showing **in any division or discipline**
Senior Novice Horse = Horses 6 and over in their first or second year of showing **in any division or discipline**
Scratches = must be made at least **two** classes in advance
Adds = added classes may be made at any time
All Day = any class with "All Day" will be a Walk/trot/jog/halt/back only
Jackpot = Open to anyone except Lead liners. \$10.00 entry fee at gate, no signups necessary. 50% paid to appropriate circuit, payback 25%, 15%, 10%, (classes 30, 31 & 50). Mid Penn Jackpot classes (June 13th ONLY) = Open to anyone—you do not have to be a Mid Penn member to participate. \$10.00 entry fee at gate, no signups necessary. 50% paid to appropriate circuit, payback 25%, 15%, 10%, (classes MP1, MP2)
GAMING SHOWS—Senior Rider = 19 and over as of January 1 current year
GAMING SHOWS—Junior Rider = 18 and under as of January 1 current year
GAMING SHOWS—Novice Rider = Riders who are in their first or second year of showing in any division or discipline
